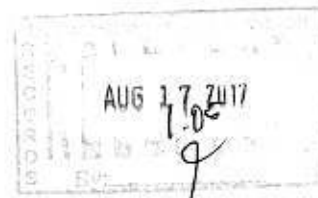

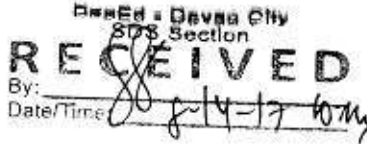
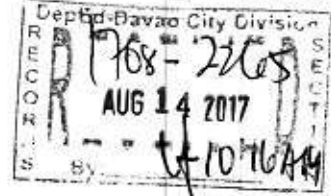

**GRANT OF SERVICE CREDITS TO TEACHER-ADVISERS
OF RED CROSS YOUTH COUNCILS (RCYC)**

To: Undersecretaries
Assistant Secretaries
Bureau and Service Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division Superintendents
Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools Heads
All Others Concerned

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) recognizes the Red Cross Youth (RCY) as one of the official co-curricular organizations in the schools as stipulated in DepEd Order No. 38, s. 2005 entitled *Recognition of the Red Cross Youth as Official Co-Curricular Organization in the Schools*. One of the major services of the Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC) is its mission to educate and empower the children and youth in the spirit of Red Cross, through constructive meetings and effective leadership, and provide opportunities for directing and harnessing their energy and idealism into worth humanitarian activities.
2. In this connection, DepEd encourages the organization of the RCYC in all public elementary and secondary schools with at least one teacher-adviser and 43 youth members as provided in DepEd Memorandum No. 102, s. 2011 entitled *Establishment of the Red Cross Youth Council and Training of Teachers in the Different Red Cross Services*. The teacher-advisers are expected to participate in the different Red Cross trainings such as First Aid, Basic Life Support (or Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and Disaster Management.
3. Recognizing the efforts and support of the teacher-advisers of the RCYC, they are hereby granted service credits of not more than ten days, exclusive of the allowable 15 days for every year pursuant to DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 entitled *Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers* for their participation in RCYC activities provided that the activity is recognized and authorized by the schools division superintendents (SDSs).
4. The school heads shall submit to the SDS the request for the grant of service credits clearly indicating the RCYC activity participated in by the teacher-adviser. The discretion to determine the number of service credits that may be allowed for participation in the RCYC activity is vested with the SDS.
5. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Order is directed.

THE 2017 INTER-SCHOOL FIRST AID COMPETITION

MECHANICS OF THE COMPETITION

1. The events and scope of applications employed in the competition are as follows:

2. Each event shall be assigned a specific area or station for teams to perform.
3. All events shall be held simultaneously. The teams' order of execution shall be determined by drawing of lots.
4. Each team shall be given only 12 minutes to perform or solve problems at each station.
5. A loud whistle blow will signal the start and end of the allotted performance time.
6. In relays, the following rules shall be applied:
 - a. **Bandaging Relay** – When signaled to start, the first member runs to the execution area, draws and executes a problem then runs back to the starting point. He then taps the second member, who will then draw and execute the next problem. The process is repeated until all problems are executed or time runs out.
 - b. **Splinting Relay** – When signaled to start, the team runs to the execution area where the team leader draws problem for the team to execute. After execution, the team runs back to the starting point and repeats the same process until all problems are executed or time runs out.
 - c. **Patient Transfer Relay** – The team leader runs to the execution area, draws a problem and calls only the required numbers of members then execute the technique that the problem requires. A turning point will be designated to determine distance to be covered during the transfer. Once done, the team runs back to the starting point except for the team leader who will then draw another problem and repeats the same process until all problems are executed or time runs out.

THE 2017 INTER-SCHOOL FIRST AID COMPETITION

GUIDELINES

Objectives:

To promote safety awareness and enhance emergency response readiness, as well as encourage first aid skill competence and develop unity, and sportsmanship among participants.

Venue: To be announced later.

Qualifications and Requirements:

1. The 2017 Inter-School First Aid Competition has **4 categories** as follows: Grade School, Junior High School, Senior High School, College/Community Red Cross Youth and is therefore open to all given categories with organized Red Cross Youth Councils only.
2. Each council is allowed to send only one team per category.
3. Team composition shall be as follows:

4. In certain circumstances and at the discretion of the chapter, team that did not reach the required number of members may still compete but only in the events that they have registered for.
5. Participants must be bonafide members of their respective school/community RCY Councils.
6. Participants must have satisfactorily completed at least a PRC Junior/Community First Aid and/or Adult Basic Life Support – CPR for Lay Rescuers Courses as supported by current completion and valid certificates.
7. Certified First Aid and/or BLS instructors are disqualified to participate as players.
8. RCY members who have participated in previous regional/national competitions as official representatives of the chapter shall also be disqualified from joining as players, specifically in the category that they have completed.
9. Participants should be physically fit to join as certified by a physician.
10. Registration forms can be obtained from the RCY Department Davao City Chapter.

11. The Registration Fee are as follows:

- JRCY = PHP 60.00/participant or PHP 1,500 per team.
- SRCY
 - Junior High School = PHP 60.00/participant or PHP 1,620 per team.
 - Senior High School = PHP 60.00/participant or PHP 1,620 per team.
- College & Com RCY = PHP 60.00/participant or PHP 1,620 per team.
- Teams that did not reach the required number of players shall pay PHP 75.00/participant.
- Registration fee shall be shouldered by the individual or the school council funds if available or you may look for sponsors.
- Registration Fees and Forms should be submitted on or before August 28, 2017.

12. Each team must have the following minimum first aid equipment and supplies during the competition proper in order to qualify. A first aid kit should also be made available. Equipments that are not indicated and required will not be allowed to use in any of the events.

13. All participants are required to wear their Type B Youth on the Move uniforms during the competition.
14. Each team should also provide their own meals and snacks, including drinking water, and other items that are deemed necessary.
15. To ensure that irrelevant and preventable problems are avoided during the competition proper, the RCY advisers, School Council Presidents or their assigned representatives are required to attend the orientation and briefing on September 7, 2017, 5:30 PM at the Davao City Red Cross Office. Failure to attend or send representatives shall disqualify the team from participating.
